

Zoology/ Biology II

Project for Second Nine Weeks

For this nine weeks, the students will be **teaching** the class about an animal. This is not just an oral report.

- Animals will be chosen out of a hat. There will be no switching of animals.
- Five class days will be given to work on the project (Nov 5th ,6th ,7th ,10th ,and 11th)
- Teachings will occur on:
 - Insects **Friday November 14th**
 - Four Students (Spider, Scorpion, Tick, Butterfly)
 - Echinoderms **Monday November 17th**
 - Four Students (Brittle Star, Sea Cucumbers, Sand Dollar, Sea Urchin)
 - Fish **Tuesday December 2nd**
 - Four Students (Hagfish, Lamprey, Shark, Stingray, Bass)
 - Amphibian **Friday December 5th**
 - Four Students (Toads, Salamanders, Frogs, Chameleons)
 - Reptiles **Friday December 12th**
 - Five Students (Lizard, Snake, Turtle, Crocodile, Tuataras)
- Keep the following things in mind
 - The lesson must be 6-7 minutes long.
 - There must be some type of visual.
 - A handout must be provided for all students. (If copies need to be made, Mrs. Gensburg must receive them the day before. Points will be deducted if the copies are not made ahead of time.)
 - Each student will devise/create a list of five questions concerning their animal. The questions must be a combination of short-answer, true/false, multiple choice, and matching.
 - Questions must be saved on the network in the assigned folder.
 - A source list must be provided to Mrs. Gensburg the day of the teaching.
 - You must respond to the blog question within one week of your teaching.
 - All questions and their answers must be submitted to Mrs. Gensburg on the day of the teaching.
 - If you are absent the day you are supposed to teach, and it is an UNEXCUSED absence you will receive a zero for the project. (Just like a test grade.)
 - If you absent the day you are to teach Mrs. Gensburg reserves you the right to **assign** you a new day to teach.
