

## VideoPodcast Review

Students will watch a Video Podcast from Science Friday. This can be done either using the App on the iPad or going to [www.sciencefriday.com](http://www.sciencefriday.com) and click on videos.

*No student in the same class period can watch the same video so as soon as you choose a video you like you must write it on the chalkboard.* This assignment should be typed in the Google Drive App.

Your review must be types using the following format:

1. Title of the file must be (First Name, Last Name, Class Period)
2. Header- Name, date, title of Video Podcast
3. Write 10 facts or ideas you learned from this article.
  - a. Use complete sentences.
  - b. Number the facts
  - c. Be sure facts come from the entire podcast (not just the first few seconds.)
  - d. Avoid pronouns (it, they) when stating a fact.
    - i. **Example of what not to do:** They were destroyed by it.
    - ii. **Example of what to do:** The fish and bird life of Santa Monica were destroyed by the California oil spill of 1993.
    - iii. Note: Each fact should stand-alone and make perfect sense.
4. Write at least one paragraph summarizing the article and your opinion of the information included in the article. What specifically did you like? What did you not like about the article? What did you learn? Was there any bias in the article? (This paragraph should be around 7-10 sentences.)
5. In the Google Drive App share the file with [Rachel.gensburg@tctchome.com](mailto:Rachel.gensburg@tctchome.com) This is the ONLY way the assignments will be accepted. No print copies, e-mail copies etc will be accepted. All work must be turned in by 11:59pm Wednesday April 9, 2014 (EST).
