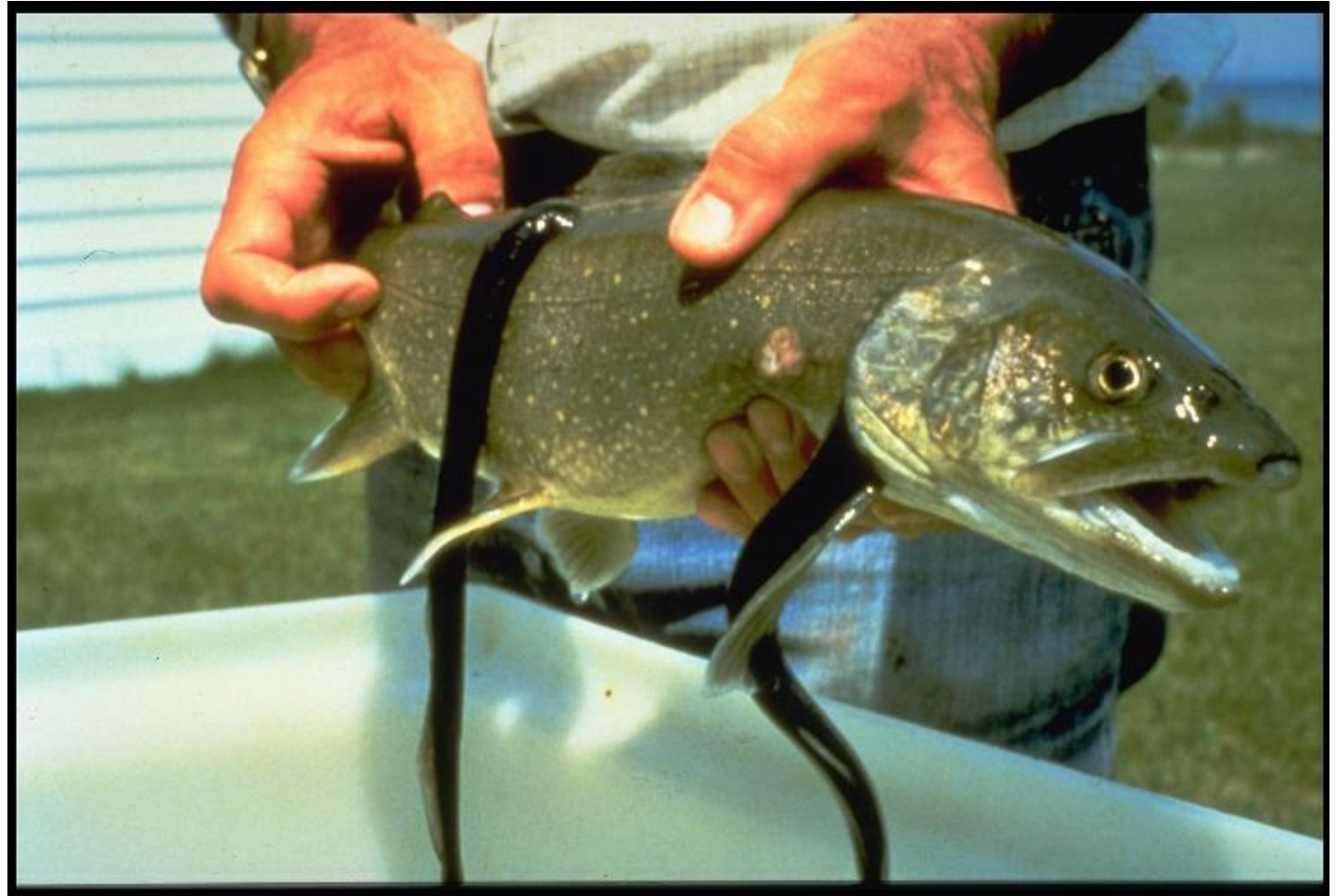

Adults physically resemble eels, in that they have no scales, and can range from _____ long.

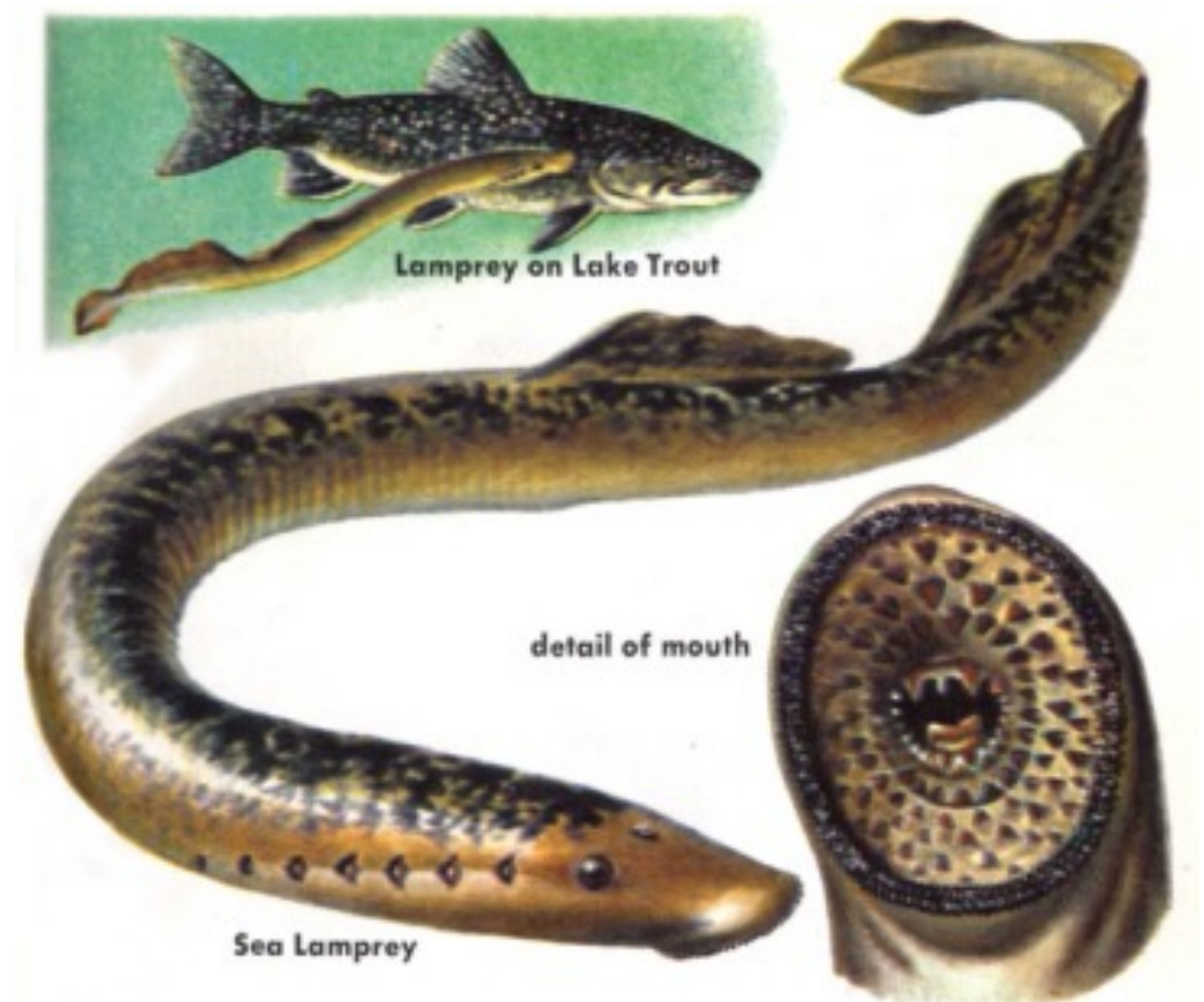
