Carry lime disease


Grow to sesame seed size (before feeding)

Dog Elcks


Can survive two years without a host Attach to host for 4 to 5 days before detaching

Lime disease

Resemble flu Symptoms People may experience: Pain areas: in the joints or muscles Skin: bull's eye pattern rash, red rashes, or redness Whole body: fatigue, fever, or malaise Joints: stiffness or swelling Also common: headache or weakness of Limb




